Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Grant Program

- Part of the CARES Act
- Expenditures should be directly related to needs resulting from COVID-19
- Funds accessed through request and approval process similar to Title II-A and Title IV-A
- Equitable share calculation is still under litigation
- ESSER Funds Guidance on Private Allowable Costs

T-IV, ESSER and GEER Purchasing Reminders

- MMSD continues to make all purchases, MMSD can not reimburse the school, teacher, or principal for items purchased.
- MMSD will order from your preferred vendor, as long as they accept Purchase Orders. There are some vendors that will not, so MMSD will find similar items and order accordingly.
- Inventory Assurances
- If item requires a remodel to install or remove, then it is not an allowable expense on federal funds





Title III Affirmation

Title III, Part A

The purpose of Title III, Part A is to increase the English proficiency of LEP (Limited English Proficient) children.

English Learners that attend a private or parochial school in the Madison Metropolitan School District are initially identified by taking the English Language Proficiency screener. Students that qualify for Title III, Part A services through this assessment then participate in the ACCESS test which annually assesses. English proficiency levels. MMDD provides a highly qualified instructor to perform the ACCESS test qualifying private or parochial school. Teachers and schools that participate in Title III can also access professional development and student consultation throughout the year to learn beta practices for English Language Learners and strategies to help individual students.


