Middle School Programs:

NEON provides up to a full day educational experience for middle-school-aged students with disabilities who are experiencing significant emotional and/or behavioral challenges resulting in safety concerns and identified with emotional behavioral disability. NEON is an off-site community based program.

School Based Alternative Program (SBA) is designed to serve 6th through 8th grade students with disabilities who are experiencing emotional and/or behavioral challenges with internalizing behaviors and have not demonstrated success in a more inclusive classroom arrangement at their home school. Program housed in Sherman Middle School

RePLAY is a collaborative program between Madison Metropolitan School District (MMSD) and Dane County Human Services – Neighborhood Intervention Program (NIP) serving 7th, 8th and 9th grade male students who display significant behavior problems in traditional middle or high school environments and who are currently under court supervision. The primary goals of the program are community protection, competency development and accountability to develop self-control and engagement in the learning process, with the projected outcome of a successful return to an MMSD educational placement. Program housed in an off-site community based program

Next Steps provides up to a full day of services to students with educational disabilities and co-occurring mental health challenges who are in sixth through eighth grade. Steps is a partnership between Madison Metropolitan School District (MMSD) and Family Service of Madison (FSM). IIP's Steps Program focuses on teaching skills for managing emotions and coping with stress in addition to academic core instruction. Steps is an off-site community based program.
