Conditions and Context



- Aging infrastructure and deferred maintenance
- Safety and security infrastructure
- Enrollment projections are stable
 - Growth on far west side
- Equity and proximity to schools and services matter
- Competition from:
 - Other districts
 - Independent charters
 - Private/parochial
- Current and projected growth in residential development and tax base
- Debt is low: we can demonstrate that we can afford to invest

Capital Improvement Criteria



Informed by public engagement:

- Prioritize safety and accessibility
- Promote equity
- Support excellence
- Expand community use
- Bolster retention and recruitment
- Improve operational efficiency

Recommendations from Dec 2017



Major **high school** reinvestment

- Aging infrastructure
- Arts, Athletics, Academics
- Alternatives

Middle school options

- Maintenance issues
- Clarification from Dec 2017 update:
 - Possible MS expansion/additions in North, South, East, West
 - K-8 possibilities
 - Needs further study

Key **elementary** investments

- North, south, east, west sequencing
- Elementary program development (e.g. full-day 4K)
- **Example of sequencing:** Build in Allis South, build on Sprecher Rd, move boundary for students around Allis to Kennedy and Elvehjem, remodel/update Allis, move Nuestro Mundo into Allis

Initial Steps Since Dec 2017



- Acacia Ridge/Dohm property
- Review district boundaries
- Standing meetings with City of Madison Planning
- Closed session discussions on land acquisition
- Security planning

Path from April 2018 to Nov 2020



Key Milestones:

- Dec 2017 started a **3-year planning** process
- Refine Dec 2017 recommendations
 - Funding in 2018-19 for professional services
- Public input and reaction to draft proposals in 2018-19
- Refresh of 20-year projections in Summer 2019
- Solid proposals in Dec 2019
- Determine need for a referendum by May 2020
- Possible referendum vote in Nov 2020
